<u>About Us:</u>

At Food Literacy Center, *we inspire kids to eat their vegetables*. Food Literacy Center came to life in July 2011 to fill a critical gap: we engage volunteers and staff to help kids improve their knowledge, attitude, and behavior towards healthy food. Partnering with SCUSD and community partners, we teach food literacy education to K-6th graders in low-income schools, using fun, approachable lessons teaching kids to cook, about nutrition, and how to improve their health. Our kids become food adventurers!

Why our work matters:

- Despite being America's Farm-to-Fork Capital, Sacramento has a 40% childhood obesity rate, and many students and families live in food deserts.
- Obesity disproportionately affects low-income and children of color.
- Obesity is now regarded as more damaging than smoking or drinking.
- All of these problems are preventable--if we eat our vegetables. But we have two generations of Americans who do not know how. That's where we come in.

This position blends program management, culinary leadership, and community engagement and reports to the Program Director. This person will bring the CEO's vision for these programs to life, working closely with the CEO, farmer, farmers market manager, and program team. This position will start with 3-5 direct reports.

Program Development & Oversight

- Design, implement, and evaluate new programs including: Plant Parts Cafe, education on the farm, farm sales, and development of the farm, etc.
- Develop program goals, objectives, and work plans
- Track key performance indicators and measure outcomes
- Continuously improve program delivery based on data and feedback
- Develop and manage program budgets
- Monitor expenses to ensure programs operate within budget
- Report program financial performance to leadership
- Other duties as assigned

Staff & Volunteer Management

- Hire, train, supervise, and evaluate program staff and consultants
- Create professional development opportunities for staff
- Manage volunteer engagement in support of program activities
- Supervise and support a growing team including 3 culinary staff, a farmer, and several consultants

- Build and maintain relationships with community partners, including church groups, governments, schools, etc.
- Represent the organization at community meetings, coalitions, and events
- Collaborate cross-functionally with other teams (development, marketing, operations)

Other things to know:

We offer a unique, healthy work culture that celebrates teamwork and vegetable eating!

- This is an at-will, exempt, full-time, on-site position. Compensation starts at \$68,640.
- Given that we are a start-up nonprofit in growth mode, a flexible schedule is necessary. This position needs to work a Saturday schedule several weeks during farmers market season and for other special events and does require some evenings and weekends. During non-market weeks, this position works Monday through Friday.
- You'll need to be able to lift 25 lbs of supplies.
- We love our veggies, so a vegetable costume may be worn on occasion!
- Because food literacy is at our core, we require all employees to successfully complete Food Literacy Academy certification and become a certified food handler. Food Literacy Center will pay for and provide the resources necessary to certify you in these areas.
- Additionally, you must pass a Department of Justice background check and have a negative TB test.
- Proof of COVID vaccination is required.
