About Us:

At Food Literacy Center, we inspire kids to eat their vegetables.

Food Literacy Center came to life in July 2011 to fill a critical gap: we engage volunteers, AmeriCorps members and staff to help individuals improve their knowledge, attitude, and behavior towards real food. Partnering with afterschool programs and libraries, we teach food literacy education to 1,000 (and growing!) K-6th graders in low-income schools a week, using fun, approachable lessons teaching kids to cook, about nutrition, and where their food comes from. Our kids become food adventurers! We work in after-school programs and libraries to accomplish this work.

Why our work matters:

- Despite being America's Farm-to-Fork Capital, Sacramento has a 40% childhood obesity rate, and many students and families live in food deserts.
- Overweight kids have a 70-80% chance of staying overweight for their entire lives, and obesity disproportionately affects low-income and minority children.
- Obesity is now regarded as more damaging than smoking or drinking.
- Being overweight can negatively impact a child's self-esteem, behavior, friendships, and academic performance.
- All of these problems are preventable--if we eat our vegetables. But we have two generations of Americans who do not know how. That's where we come in.

About this Peachy Position:

The Volunteer & Community Partnerships Coordinator is a dynamic entry-level position whose priorities will be to ensure programs run smoothly and are of top quality, providing joyful experiences for both children and volunteers; and to ensure Food Literacy Center has a clear, strong and compelling external presence.

The Volunteer & Community Partnerships Coordinator will assist with program logistics, AmeriCorps program record-keeping and reporting, and volunteer coordination. The Coordinator will curate engaging content for Food Literacy Center's social media channels and website; and coordinate individual and institutional donor communications. In addition, the Coordinator will provide organizational development support, including event logistics, and other nonprofit administration tasks. The ideal candidate is a multidisciplinary Jack/Jill of all trades who has strong communication skills, strong organizational skills, the desire to be part of a nimble, results-oriented team, and a passion for inspiring kids to eat their vegetables.

The Volunteer & Community Partnerships Coordinator will work closely with the program manager, community partnerships director, AmeriCorps members, volunteers, and community partners. This role reports to the Program Manager.

Here's what you'll do as our Volunteer & Community Partnerships Coordinator:

Ensure the health and sustainability of Food Literacy Center's program by overseeing logistics, and managing program records and reporting.

- Monitor timesheets and training records for accuracy and timeliness.
- Provide oversight for AmeriCorps members on program supply procurement and transport.
- Coordinate training calendar and coordinate training logistics with community partners
- Assign program specific tasks to AmeriCorps members to ensure all program needs are met (driving schedules, school schedules, cleaning tasks, inventory management, etc)
- Assist Program Manager with data collection/analysis for purposes of reporting and telling a compelling story of our work.
- Assist with logistics and community collaborations for Food Literacy Academy.
- Become certified as a Food Genius

Recruit, train, and manage volunteers for school programs, and outreach events.

- Compose and send bi-weekly emails to volunteers detailing volunteer opportunities
- Communicate with current and potential volunteers
- Schedule and facilitate volunteer information sessions
- Coordinate volunteer screening process, ensuring that records are accurate and all
 potential volunteers are background checked and interviewed.
- Track volunteer hours
- Plan and execute volunteer appreciation events
- Train designated AmeriCorps member(s) to assist with volunteer outreach.
- Answer basic community questions and requests
- Build and maintain relationships with volunteers.

Coordinate program communications and community engagement.

- Coordinate editorial calendar and manage online & social media content assignments delegated to staff, AmeriCorps members, and volunteers
- Curate, devise, execute, and post content across all Food Literacy Center social media platforms, including Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.
- Draft, edit, and schedule content for regular newsletter
- Responsible for the organizational email inbox and respond to outreach from the public
- Collaborate to draft additional external communications
- Prepare and present bi-weekly communication reports using Google Analytics, social media analytics, etc to the Community Partnerships Director

Assist Community Partnerships Director and Executive Director in fundraising activities.

- Initiate donor communications, including updates, administer donor thank you letters, and manage recordkeeping in the fundraising database DonorPerfect
- Implement nonprofit mailings, special projects and events to steward and cultivate individual and corporate donors (including Sacramento Food Film Festival, third party events, etc.)

As Volunteer & Community Partnerships Coordinator, you'll exhibit these key <u>job</u> <u>competencies</u>.

- Organized: Shows a strong ability to plan. Keeps accurate and timely records, and strives to meet and exceed program and fundraising goals.
- Achievement-orientation: Demonstrates an ability to meet and exceed goals and
 expectations. Lives up to the high standard the community expects of our nonprofit,
 showing attention to detail. Identifies problems and seeks to solve them quickly.
 Strategizes ideas for program improvement and communicates ideas effectively with
 supervisor.
- Human-centered: Is ambidextrous in their ability to relate to varying personalities. Goes
 above and beyond to think through the details to create fantastic volunteer and donor
 experiences. Gains volunteer and donor trust and respect, and meets or exceeds their
 expectations.
- Relationship Development & Communication: Externally, must be able to build new
 relationships while growing existing ones. Able to connect with almost anyone, find
 common ground, and create agency advocates through interactions. Additionally,
 exceptional at writing compelling on-brand communications. Internally, establish highly
 productive and positive working relationships with other staff and AmeriCorps members.

You'll be successful in this position if you:

- Have a deep commitment to the mission of Food Literacy Center
- Align with our team's values and behaviors (see below)
- Have a high degree of comfort with change and ambiguity

- Have strong communications skills in copy and creative writing.
- Are tech-savvy, a go getter, and comfortable toggling between functions and roles.
- Ability to work well in a collaborative, team environment.
- Have the ability to organize and prioritize assignments and tasks, as well as adapt and react quickly as projects evolve.
- Have a Bachelor's degree or equivalent experience
- Have an understanding or familiarity with local food, food systems, and nutrition

Extra points if you have:

- Experience with DonorPerfect or a similar databases
- Customer service or sales experience
- Graphic design experience
- Experience working in a small, entrepreneurial start-up team
- Experience working with food literacy and/or AmeriCorps programs

Other Things to Know:

We offer a unique, vegetable-oriented work culture that celebrates teamwork, health, and vegetable eating.

- The position pays \$12-15/hour DOE and is a non-exempt position.
- Given that we are a start-up nonprofit in growth mode, a flexible schedule is necessary. This position may require some nights and weekends
- You'll need to be able to lift 40 lbs
- This position requires you to travel throughout Sacramento, so reliable transportation, a California driver's' license, and proof of insurance are required
- There is moderate local travel required in this position -- you'll be traveling back and forth between offices and schools.
- We love our veggies, so a vegetable costume may be worn on occasion
- Because food literacy is at our core, we require all employees to successfully complete Food Literacy Academy certification
- Additionally, you must pass a Department of Justice background check and have a negative TB test
